A Note from Meg ...

The original idea sparking our decision to rotate this weekly "Note" among the members of the Pastoral Team, is to allow each of us to share a bit about what our specific role is on the Staff and in the Parish. Our hope is to provide parishioners more clarity in knowing how the Parish functions and who they may want to contact or communicate with regarding concerns or questions.

I have been part of the Parish since it was formed in 2008 and was commissioned a Lay Ecclesial Minister just as All Saints Parish was emerging. As a Pastoral Associate, my "official" job description calls for sharing with the Pastoral Team the overall care of the Parish. Here at All Saints, as you may know, we currently have two full-time Pastoral Associates: one focused on Administration functions along with Ministry with our Congolese Community – this is our Peter Daino. As my title (Pastoral Associate & Coordinator of Liturgy) indicates, my role generally includes assisting the community operationally in a wide-variety of Mission-related ways including implementing initiatives, carryingout Parish commitments and interfacing with the wider Catholic, Interfaith and secular community. Along with that, a focal point of my Ministry is "Coordinating" our Liturgies, which involves working with Sr. Terri Laureta and the range of presiders, homilists, lectors, ministers of communion, music ministers, ushers, greeters, hospitality ministers, and altar servers who need to be "in place" when we come together to worship! As many of you know, "behind the scenes," there is planning for our seasonal celebrations, sacristan functions, attention to liturgical décor, etc. All in the service of creating an environment in which the Spirit moves freely and grace-fully to feed and nurture our faith community.

Separate from any official professional staff position or job description, again as many of you know, this Parish Community has been my spiritual home since the mid-1980s! It is my privilege to offer my service to this Community and to each of you as individuals; please never hesitate to come to me with any concern or question. Thank You!

This weekend, we welcome members of the Senior Leadership Team of the Rescue Mission of Syracuse who will update us on plans for the opening of the LGBTQ+ affirmative shelter for youth (ages 12-17) to be located in the former Dorothy Day House across the street on Lancaster Place. We are honored that Carolyn Hendrickson, Senior Philanthropy Officer will be with us at our 4pm Mass on Saturday and Executive Director Dan Sieberg, will be with us at both our Sunday Masses. In the city of Syracuse, 40% of our youth experiencing homelessness identify as LGBTQ+. Our Parish and neighborhood welcomes this wonderful ministry that will open in the spring!
