A Note from Barbara Hadley...

I have been asked, as part of the Staff, to share what my role is as Coordinator of Pastoral Care. In this Parish, the heart of this Ministry is the visitation of parishioners who are hospitalized, in Rehab, Nursing Homes, Assisted Living, or are homebound. These visits are to let our parishioners know that they remain a part of the All Saints Family even when they are temporarily or permanently unable to be physically present at our Liturgies. The most appreciated part of the visit is receiving Eucharist and praying together as well as friendly conversation. At times, providing transportation to doctor appointments, or small errands may be done. Also as part of our Ministry, parishioners receive a weekly Bulletin sent out by our Dick Nabinger and Birthday or Sympathy cards are sent by our Cynthia Haythe as needed. The book, The Next Place is given to parishioners who have lost a close family member as a remembrance from the Parish.

Every Christmas and Easter, gift bags are assembled with a plant, cards and ornaments made by the children in Faith Formation, along with a copy of the daily reflection booklet. These are distributed by members of the Parish.

An extension of Pastoral Care is Outreach. The main project has been the receiving, unpacking, sorting and repacking of over 1400 winter clothing items and blankets provided by the Zumiez Foundation. This year our team packed boxes that were then distributed to 8 agencies in the community serving adults/children, particularly those who are homeless. We can always use more volunteers; visits usually are 30-60 minutes on a weekly or every two week basis. If interested, give me a call at 315-439-6240. Thanks!

**UPDATE: Rescue Mission's
Runaway & Homeless Youth Shelter Update:**

Thanks for your input last weekend concerning the Pastoral Council's recommendation to give a \$25,000 one-time gift to the Rescue Mission's new Youth Shelter to be located in the former Dorothy Day House across the street from our church. The gift would come from a 10% tithing of the second of two bequests from our late Tom Tomzack's estate: an unrestricted gift of \$238,000. Results from your input: A total of 186 folks responded: 178 – Yes; 6 – No. Two forms recorded comments, but indicated no preference or abstention.

A couple of clarifications: 10% of \$238,000 would, of course, be \$23,800. The Pastoral Council decided on the final figure of \$25,000. Also: Tom's *first* bequest was restricted to use on the church & Annex buildings. This gift primarily provided funding for the addition to the church (the "Tomzack Room"). The later and separate gift of \$238,000 was unrestricted and funded the purchase and installation of the new boiler in the Bishop Harrison Center.



Parish Response to Coronavirus, Influenza, etc.

As you know, in an attempt to avoid exposure to the various viruses of current concern, we have temporarily suspended the distribution of the Precious Blood from the shared Cup. Based on medical advice, we are further requesting that folks also suspend holding hands during the "Our Father" and refrain from shaking hands – or other physical contact – at the Sign of Peace. We have also emptied the Holy Water Fonts as another precaution. Traditionally, advice was to use 'common sense' which advised that if you're not feeling well, avoid contact with others. More recently, we have learned that a person can be contagious 2 or 3 days *before* they develop symptoms. With a great number of children and seniors in our Parish – we are recommending an abundance of caution. Thank you for your understanding and cooperation!

Caring for Our Common Home:
“Praised be You, my Lord, through Sister Water, So useful, humble, precious and pure.”

Consider the ways in which you can conserve the precious resource of water in your daily life. Best practices for conserving water can be found here: <http://bit.ly/ConserveWater2020>
 75% of water used indoors is in the bathroom, & 25% of this is for the toilet. **The average toilet uses 4 gallons per flush.** You can invest in a ULF (ultra-low flush) toilet which will use only 2gpf. *OR:* you can install a simple tank bank, costing about \$2, which will save .8gpf. Using simple methods like tank banks, low-flow showerheads & faucet aerators you can retrofit your home for under \$50. **By using water-saving features you can reduce your in-home water use by 35%! On a daily basis, the average household, using 350 gallons per day, could save 125 gallons of water per day.** The average individual, currently using 70 gallons per day, *could save 25 gallons of water per day!*
